Did you know that the Apache County Library District has its own Website?

The site has information on each library in the district as well as the district itself. Pictures of the libraries are included with addresses, phone numbers, and contact information for the libraries. Library and district staff are listed, and links are available to contact the staff.

The Library District is currently working to automate all of the libraries. And though this task is not complete, the material catalogs as far as they are completed for each of the libraries is available today. Anyone can access the catalogs from any computer with Internet access. Once the system is live -- which will be within the calendar year -- holds can be placed on items, renewals can be made, and a patron can check his or her reading list as well as what has been checked out. Anyone can explore the catalog, but to access a patron account, a current library card will be needed. Registration for the new cards has begun at the libraries, and new cards will be given to patrons when the system is live.

Other features of the Website include links to the Apache County website and all of its departments, the Arizona State Library, a home work help link, and a directory of various public libraries in the United States. Another available link is to the statewide databases where, *“Arizona residents may explore thousands of online articles and images from journals, newspapers and accurate, current research materials.”*
