Don't you just hate when you go to the public library and all of the computers are busy?



Some of the people are draped in cobwebs, and you are sure they've been there longer than an hour.

And then, when you finally get to a computer and try to print, you get twenty pages instead of the two you really needed costing you \$2.00 instead of 20 cents?



Both of these problems can be solved by EnvisionWare – a public computer and print management software. The [St. Johns Public Library will be closed on Saturday, October 10th](#) while EnvisionWare is being installed, and the program will be operational on Tuesday, October 13th. EnvisionWare allows patrons to login directly to a public access computer, times their session, and manages their printing activity. Since this software links all of these activities to a patron's library account, all users must have a current library card in their possession to log on. (If you do not have your new card, please bring proof of residency with you, and a card can be issued.) The system also requires all fines and fees to be paid in advance of computer use.

Minors will need to have parent permission to use the computers. Parents or guardians only need to sign the form once that allows a minor's use.

EnvisionWare will soon be used at all the libraries in Apache County. Come join us as we continue to improve technology at your public library.
