



INTERNET SAFETY CLASSES



The Apache County Library District is offering Internet safety classes during the months of August and September. Find out if your information is safe on the Internet. What are your children/students really doing when they are online? What is proper online etiquette? What can you do about spam in your email and pop-up ads while you are online? What is Cyberbullying and what can you do about it?

Instructor, Dolly Patterson, will be the teacher for the courses. She has completed training in Internet security, and will be sharing her knowledge with the public.

Class 1 – Cyber Security: How to keep your personal information safe online, and also how to protect your computer from viruses and Spyware, will be taught at the Round Valley Public Library on Friday, August 6th, from 2:00-3:00 and at the St. Johns Public Library Thursday, August 12th, from 2:00 to 3:00 P.M.

Class 2 – Cyber Citizenship – Cyberbullying: Covers proper online etiquette (“Netiquette”) and the problem of online bullying, will be taught at the Round Valley Public Library on Friday, August 20th, from 2:00-3:00 and at the St. Johns Public Library Thursday, August 26th, from 12:00 to 1:00 P.M. Classes coming in September include Personal Safety – Predator Identification and Intellectual Property.
