

STAGE 3 FIRE RESTRICTIONS

ARE IN EFFECT FOR APACHE AND NAVAJO COUNTY

Restrictions are for unincorporated areas outside of Tribal, State or Federal jurisdictions. Some cities and towns are under restrictions but not all. Please verify with local jurisdictions if you are unsure.

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

Liquefied petroleum or natural gas grills, stoves, or fire pits used in a barren area **COMPLETELY CLEAR** of all debris, flammable materials and vegetation, including any hanging over head.

Lawn mowers, weed eaters (with an approved spark arrestor) may be used only in areas that have been previously treated, or in established garden areas. **DO NOT USE** in dry or untreated areas without a permit from local fire authorities.

Generators and portable generators (with an approved spark arrestor) are to be used according to manufacturer's instructions. Generators **MUST** be placed in an a barren area clear of vegetation, debris, and other flammable materials.

The following can be done only if a Fire Restriction Exemption Permit is issued:
Any outdoor welding must be done in a completely enclosed area preventing embers from escaping and/or an area approved by your local Fire Authorities.

For safety purposes it is suggested that a pressurized water supply or fire extinguisher be maintained and available in the area of any of these outdoor activities!

Unincorporated areas of both Apache and Navajo Counties use fire restrictions to help prevent unwanted, human-caused fires and to limit the exposure of visitors during periods of potentially dangerous fire conditions.
